Score calculation

The instrument uses a 5-point Likert scale ranging from 0 (negative experience) to 4 (positive experience).

The total score is the sum of all the questions.

The possible score on the scale ranges from 0 to 52, 0 meaning a very poor experience of integrated care, and 52 meaning an excellent experience of integrated care.

In item #3, determine whether the answer is a missing value.

- If there is no missing value, the Picker's total score is equal to the sum of the values (e.g. 22).
- If there is a missing value in question #3, a rule of three must be performed to bring the score back to a total of 52.

Example:

22 / 48 (total with the missing value)

→ X / 52 (total without the missing value)

$$X = 22 \times 52 \div 48 = 23.8$$
