
Aim

To evaluate the psychometric properties of the PORTRAIT-10 in individuals living with chronic pain.



Validation study

- Members of the Quebec Association of Chronic Pain (Canada) https://aqdc.info/en/
- Web link to the study procedures and informed consent form
- Individuals with chronic pain for a minimum of 3 months, aged
 18 or over, access to the Internet, and spoke French
- Patient partners



Data collection

INTERMED-Self Assessment (IMSA)

PORTRAIT-10 (at 0 and 3 weeks)

Pain Catastrophizing Scale (PCS)

Analysis

Internal consistency

Cronbach alpha (α) coefficients

Test-retest realiability

Spearman correlation coefficients

Convergent validity

Correlation of PORTRAIT-10 scores with IMSA scores

Discriminant validity

Correlation of PORTRAIT-10 scores with PCS scores

Cut-off scores on the PORTRAIT-10

Receiver operator characteristic (ROC) curves

Results

295 participants

88.3% identifying as female

Mean age 53.3 ± 9.3 years

Pain duration from 2 to 65 years (median: 15 years)

Results

Internal consistency

Cronbach alpha (α) = 0.67



Spearman correlation = ρ = 0.85, p < .0001



Correlation between the PORTRAIT-10 and the IMSA ($\rho = 0.74$, p < 0.0001)

Discriminant validity

Correlation with the PCS ($\rho = 0.34$)

Cut-off scores on the PORTRAIT-10

Cut-off score (10) demonstrated good sensitivity (0.86) and specificity (0.71)

Strenghts	Limitations
Valuable insights into the psychometric properties of a novel questionnaire	Specific population of people with chronic pain
Good sample size	Validity and reliability of only the French version of PORTRAIT-10

Conclusion: PORTAIT-10

- Valuable tool for assessing the complexity of biopsychosocial needs
- Enables the identification of individuals with the most complex needs
- Facilitates the provision of appropriate integrated care, essential for reducing health inequities



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
